

## **Upgrades planned for Duntroon**

Improved tee decks, green renovation among plans for this season

Major changes and upgrades are happening at Duntroon Highlands Golf Club this season.

Starting this spring, the tee decks on #4, #6, #7, #8 and a new pumphouse, upgraded switching systems, #9 will be renovated. Additionally, #11, #15, and #16 tee and buried hydro and fiber lines, will protect critical decks will be upgraded during the second half of the season.

In the fall, the #7 green complex will undergo a renovation, enhancing both its playability and beauty. An aggressive overseeding and aeration program will help keep greens and tee decks in good condition.

A new cart path on #7 and upgrades to paths at #1, #2, #4, and #9 will make navigation smoother and more enjoyable. The addition of tar and chip sections and experimental entrance and exit structures will improve functionality. Fresh sand will be added to bunkers, ensuring they remain consistent and challenging for players.

The course will also see improved stormwater management and measures to prevent driveway washouts. A revamped irrigation system, featuring a new pumphouse, upgraded switching systems, and buried hydro and fiber lines, will protect critical infrastructure.

Looking ahead, a secondary electric pump is planned for 2025, solidifying water management capabilities. Practice facilities will receive a boost with a new bunker, and additional hitting decks.

They will also be working with a professional gardening service to enhance the clubhouse gardens and five other key areas starting in May, creating a more inviting atmosphere.

Twenty-five new carts were scheduled to arrive this spring and some new maintenance equipment and course accessories such as ball washers, pins, garbage cans, vardage markers and signage will be added.

Off-season changes at Cobble Beach Golf Links include the hiring of a new assistant golf professional and the promotion of a long-time employee to the General Manager's position.



# Ainsdale upgrades

Cart path project nears completion, new tee box built on 8th hole

Course upgrades are continuing this season at Ainsdale Golf Course near Kincardine.

The construction of gravel cart paths has been an ongoing project and they now have completed the entire front 9. Work began on #10 last year and they now have a continuous path from #10 to #13. Holes #14, 15, & 16 are partially complete and #17 & 18 are done.

Another big improvement has been the construction of a new, large, flattened tee box on

the par 3 8th hole.

The work was done by staff with assistance from Kempton's Construction in Ripley.

"Hard work from both Kempton's and our staff proved to be well worth it throughout the process as it provides a much larger teeing ground for more positions to hit from and overall tee and turf health," said Taylor Candler, who owns the course along with her husband Charles.

# Best result yet

Simcoe County golfer finishes 4th and is now ranked 20th on PGA Tour Americas

Drew Nesbitt, who has played out of Braestone Club near Orillia in recent years, recorded his best career result on the PGA Tour Americas earlier this season.

The 30-year-old shot 65-65-68-71 to tie for 4th at the 70th ECP Brazil Open in Rio de Janeiro in early April.

At his next event - the KIA Open in Ecador from April 24-27 - he shot rounds of 72-69-69 and finished tied for 42nd in the weather-shortened tournament.

He is currently ranked 20th on the tour and has earned \$9,151.

The top 120 players on the PGA TOUR Americas Points List after 15 events are eligible for the Fortinet Cup Championship. The top-10 players on the final Fortinet Cup Standings will earn exempt Korn Ferry Tour membership for the following season.

Nesbitt, whose parents live in the Horseshoe Valley area, previously played on the PGA Tour Latinoamerica but that tour and the PGA Tour Canada have now merged to create the PGA Tour Americas - a pathway tour to feed into the Korn Ferry Tour.

Play started in March 2024 and the inaugural PGA TOUR Americas schedule included 16 events spanning across Latin America, Canada and the United States.

Two continents and eight different countries hosted players competing for the chance to earn their way onto the Korn Ferry Tour, and ultimately onto the PGA TOUR.

Combining PGA TOUR Latinoamérica and PGA TOUR Canada allows for two competitive swings throughout the year, with six events in Latin America from March to May, followed by 10 North American events running from June to September.

Each tournament, aside from the season-ending Fortinet Cup Championship, is a four-day, 72-hole stroke play competition featuring a 36-hole cut after two rounds.

In addition to 10 exempt Korn Ferry Tour cards via the season-long points race, up to five conditional Korn Ferry Tour cards are available to the top two finishers in the Latin America Swing and the top three finishers in the North America Swing, if these players do not finish in the top 10 on the final PGA TOUR Americas Points List.

Since turning pro, Nesbitt has played in the RBC Canadian Open in 2023, 2019 and 2017 and Monday qualified for the Honda Classic PGA Tour event in 2019 where he made the cut. His accomplishments also include shooting 59 on the PGA Tour Latinoamerica in 2018 and claiming victory in the tour's Abertio Mexicano de Golf event in 2019.

Joining the club as an Assistant Golf Pro is Dustin



July 8 - Tangle Creek Golf & Country Club near Barrie


July 24 - Monterra Golf Club at Blue Mountain Resort



## Ferns course closes

Owner of Markdale-area course has decided to discontinue public play

Harold Elders, owner of the Ferns Golf Resort near Markdale, announced earlier this spring that the 18-hole course will be permanently closed to the public.

The course opened in 2005 and, after 20 years, Harold, who is 78, has decided to retire from the business.

He will retain 12 of the holes for his own personal use and sell five large parcels of golf course property for housing development. One of the parcels will include holes 1, 2 and 3 and a second one holes 4, 5 & 6.

The course was initially built as 9 holes for Elder's
